I've heard these verses from Isaiah many times over the years, especially as Christmas approaches. They bring back such

good memories of candlelight services, time spent with family and friends, and looking at Christmas lights.

Handel's "Messiah" is such a beautiful rendition of these verses. The music and words fill my heart with joy. It's like the feeling of a song that brings back amazing memories; or going someplace familiar; or the feeling of the good life or a warm home.

I was reading some of the comments on YouTube about the London Philharmonic

Isaiah 9:6-7

rendition of the "Messiah," and one comment read, "As a child, my parents filled our home with this timeless piece of music. My dad believes this is the music that will accompany Christ during his second coming. Now that I'm older, I think my dad is right. Thanks, mom and dad." When I saw this comment, it made me smile.

As I read the passage over again, It strikes me that the second part hasn't come true yet. The first part is fulfilled when we celebrate Christmas in the person of Jesus Christ. He came first as a babe in a manger, wrapped in swaddling cloths, and ultimately as the Suffering Servant that would pay for our sins. That's what Christmas is all about!

But the second part of this passage tells of a mighty king who will have the government on his shoulders, and of his government and PEACE, there will be no end. He will establish and sustain it with justice and righteousness from

# God is Charity's refuge and strength

"Be still, and know that I am God. I will be exalted among the nations, I will be exalted in the earth!" Psalm 46:10.

This Bible verse was shared by Kathy Wermager towards the beginning of an informational forum held by Charity's Vision Council and Call Committee to update our congregation on the call process for a senior pastor. Psalm 46 begins with, "God is our refuge and strength, an ever-present help in trouble." What a good word to share.

In this transition at Charity, our congregation has an overwhelming need: to be faithful to God's guidance and His Word. It can be hard to "be still" and to "wait on the Lord" because we think we know what we want, but it's what we're called to do during this time. It is my hope and prayer is that we are supportive of those on the Vision Council and Call Committee who have been chosen to lead us as we move forward in this process; that we are supportive of Charity's staff as they work day in and day out doing the work they've been hired to do; and that we are supportive

of each other as we grow in faith and service together.

How can we, as a congregation, be faithful to God's guidance? A critical way is through corporate prayer, gathering together to pray for His guidance in our transition.

In Acts, when Peter preached to the crowd, through the working of the Holy Spirit, thousands became believers.

And what did these new believers do? "They devoted themselves to the apostles' teaching and to fellowship, to the breaking of bread and to prayer." Acts 2:42. As we look to schedule a time of periodic corporate prayer (stay tuned), please lift up Charity daily in your personal prayer life, and also be open to meeting with other Charity folks to seek God's will and guidance for this special

congregation of believers.

Thank you for your tithes and offering. As you can see by the accompanying financial chart, we have reduced our year-to-date general fund deficit to just under \$2,200, nearly even


Charity's annual meeting of the Voters' Assembly will be held on Sunday, Jan. 9, at which time the budget vote will be held.

# What is Intentional Interim Ministry?

Last month we met jointly with the Vision Council about hiring an intentional interim pastor. See the information below, "What Is It?" which provides more perspective on how this ministry works with churches.

Also in November, we visited with Charity staff to get their thoughts on what they would like to see in our next senior pastor. We appreciate them taking time to share with us their perspectives on this time of transition.

Several committee members participated in the congregational forum with the Vision Council on Nov. 21. Thanks to everyone who attended and shared your views.

#### What is it?

The Intentional Interim Ministry promotes renewed congregational health in seasons of pastoral transition. Trained Intentional Interim Pastors, Consultants, and Coaches are available to help churches navigate these transitions based on the needs of the congregation and the community it serves. An intentional interim can create momentum for the church's mission in contrast to the typical slumping season that is marked by waiting.

Types of Intentional Interim Ministries

• The Transitioning Church

A congregation that has experienced a long-term pastorate and needs to create space between the old and new.

A congregation that is facing challenges and changes as it looks to future ministry.

#### • The Teams Church

A congregation with staff and/or multiple ministries that require an evaluation and strategy for receiving and working with a new pastor.

#### • The Troubled Church

A congregation that has experienced a split, a controversial resignation of the pastor, or some other stressor.

#### • The Tranquil Church

A congregation that is plateaued or declining due to neglect with regard to their mission, vision, and values.

#### • The Terminal Church

A congregation that may be nearing the end of its life cycle and needs to transition through a hospice or closure time and/or adapt to a different form of ministry.

• Note-Some churches represent a combination of these needs.

# Being 'in' Christ

There are many ways to remind of God's daily blessings. The gift of good health and the ability to walk two miles down the road enjoying the last of the temperate fall days. Simply looking out the window and seeing thousands of geese flying overhead, making a joyful noise to the Lord, makes my heart ache with joy.

Once again, during my daily devotion time, I experienced a light bulb moment. My mother passed away five years ago in October. She wasn't a reader. As you know, most of that generation only attended school until the eighth grade before working full-time on the farm, or as in my mother's case, eventually off the farm.

During the last five years of her earthly struggle, I made a point to call her every day and try to visit as often as possible as we moved her in and out of assisted living and nursing home care. It wasn't very easy.

My mom's Bible was always on the coffee table in their modest condo. I don't know which of her children has it, but I remember picking it up on occasion. Inside the pages was a photo of mom when she was about 18.

I knew even though she didn't like to read; she was reading her Bible. I wasn't sure about the significance of that photo until I heard Nicki Gumbel talk about "being in Christ."

Galatians 3:26-28 reads, "So in Christ Jesus you are all children of God through faith, for all of you who were baptized into Christ have clothed yourselves with Christ. There is neither Jew nor Gentile, neither slave nor free, nor is there male

and female, for you are all one in Christ Jesus."

Gumbel made a case for this passage in Galatians using what he had learned

from Colin Urquhart's book "In Christ Jesus." He said, "I had never realized how significant that little word 'in' is in the New Testament.

Oid you Know? Understanding

that, as a Christian, you are 'in' Christ Jesus revolutionizes how you see yourself, your self-image, your identity and how you understand your value to God."

His suggestion was to write your name on paper, hold your Bible to represent Christ, place the paper in the Bible, and close it. Now, you are in Christ wherever your Bible goes; you go in Christ, not as a part of the book, but totally identified with the book.

Whoa. Light-bulb moment.

Isn't that a great reminder of who we are? During her final days on earth, albeit unwittingly, my mom placed herself "in" Christ. She spent time with him daily, remembering all the lessons of her childhood.

Even though I am unsure who has her Bible, I know where the photo is – in my Bible reminding me that I know where she is - "in Christ" until we meet again in heaven.

## 4 Ways To Participate


