The pastor process

Wow! What a welcome my wife and I have received from so many kind members of Charity. We are grateful for the kind words, the gift basket, the carrying of heavy boxes, the furniture assembling, the patience as I learn a new culture and practices, and the prayers. Over time, I will need fewer travel directions and restaurant recommendations – but my need for your prayers will not relent.

Preparing to search, sift, select, confirm and welcome a new pastor is a complicated formula that can be reduced to:

Heed the Governing Documents

+ Assessment

- + Discernment
- + Much Prayer and obedience to the Holy Spirit
 - = Good Pastoral Transition

It is natural (because churches are filled with human beings) that our individual wants and sometimes biases bubble up to the surface. It is okay to acknowledge and appreciate that such feelings exist. But, a godly pastoral search process that seeks obedience to the Holy Spirit can not be confused with a popularity contest or wish list.

Persistently, I will seek your prayers to under-gird this whole process. In the coming months, I will also seek your input through various means, including a thorough computer-based survey and opportunities to discuss and share in person. This information will be available to the Vision Council and the Call Committee. They will join their prayers to all of our prayers and then seek a qualified pool of applicants.

It will be the responsibility of the Call Committee (with input from the

Vision Council) to determine what particular attributes should guide the sifting process. Thus far, we only know the minimum qualifications as outlined in Charity's Constitution and Bylaws:

1. "are clergy of, and/or

recommended for consideration by the Lutheran Congregations in Mission for Christ" - Charity Constitution Article VI. (This means candidates who possess a Masters of Divinity from an accredited seminary and have successfully passed an LCMC interview assessing their theological fitness.)

2. "who accept and pledge faithful adherence to the confessions of the congregation as set forth in the Preamble and Article II of this Constitution" – also Charity Constitution Article VI.

3. Which means: The congregation confesses faith in the Triune God - Father, Son, and Holy Spirit; In the Father, the creator and sustainer of the universe; In the Son, Jesus Christ our Lord and Savior who died and rose again for the redemption of a fallen humanity; and In the Spirit, who calls, gathers, enlightens and sanctifies the Christian church and preserves it in union with Jesus Christ in the faith. July Vision Council update

Greetings from the Vision Council.

I am happy to announce that Dennis Simenson is our newest member of the Vision Council. Thank you, Dennis, for accepting the position, and I know it will be great working with you.

Most of you know that Pastor Brad started his Intentional Interim Position on June 1. He will be with us for the next year, helping with the transition to our next called senior pastor. I have had the opportunity to preview his newsletter submission for this month, and I suspect many of us will find it quite controversial.

Right after reading Pastor Brad's newsletter article, I spent a little time with Marian reading our daily devotional.

A brief excerpt from that was as follows "a trusting response includes Me in your thoughts as you consider strategies to deal with a situation. My continual Presence is a promise, guaranteeing that you never have to face anything alone. My children teethe on the truth that I am always with them, yet they stumble around in a stupor, unaware of My loving Presence all around them. How that grieves Me!"

What a powerful reminder. Am I forming my strategies in His Presence, or am I charging ahead with thoughts independent of His Presence?

I am also reminded of many occasions where a spouse or a friend has held up a mirror for me to look into. Often, I did not like what I saw, but instead of seeing the true image of myself and dealing with that, I lashed out at the person simply holding the mirror.

I feel like Pastor Brad is holding the mirror in front of Charity Lutheran. We all have a choice on how we respond to that. We need to be focused on what we see in the mirror and humbly ask for our Lord's Presence as we look to strengthen, unify, and discern God's will in what is reflected in that mirror.

The man God has sent us is not here to impose his version of the church but to help us navigate through the transition process. There are rough waters ahead, and it will be uncomfortable for all of us. I find peace in the idea that God already knows where we are to land as a church, and he is putting each one of us through this to allow us to grow in our faith if we engage positively in this process.

We each need to choose how we are going to go forward through this transition we are in. I intend to strive to stay in His Presence. To humbly and as honestly as possible view my past, present and future words and deeds in that mirror. I accept that I will need much grace and also need to extend much grace. I also intend to keep Pastor Brad and Charity lifted up in prayer, as many of you are.

As a final thought, I will close with this. The man holding the mirror before us is not responsible for what is being revealed. He is simply the man holding the mirror reflecting Charity's past, Charity's Constitution, Bylaws, and if we remain faithful and prayerfully discerning, some of our possible future

accepts the canonical scripture of the Old and New Testaments as the divinely inspired, revealed, and inerrant Word of God and the only infallible authority in all matters of faith and life. As brief and true statements of the doctrine of the Word of God, the congregation accepts the following: The Apostolic, the Nicene, and the Athanasian Creeds; the Unaltered Augsburg Confession; Luther's Small Catechism; and the Book of Concord of 1580. - Charity Constitution Article VI.

Many of you have never read the Book of Concord of 1580. Your next called pastor needs to have both studied, accepted, and pledged faithful adherence to it. As a member of the LCMC (especially a relatively early member), Charity has taken a bold doctrinal stand. Charity's constitution enshrines these credal and confessional distinctives as "unalterable" elements of the constitution - meaning that they must be preserved perpetually and are not subject to amending.

Are there great leaders, preachers, prayers, and pastoral caregivers who do not fit these criteria? Absolutely! Part of our beautiful confessional heritage is the embrace of the Priesthood of All Believers. We thank God that all disciples have a meaningful role to fulfill in the work of the Kingdom. Pastoral qualifications do not negate the necessary participation of all parts of the Body of Christ. Pastoral qualifications do, however, exist for pastors.

One might charitably describe Charity's history of pastoral transitions as "complicated." This is a truthful and objective historical description. I pledge this to you so far as my authority and influence permit, this transition will follow the governing documents, and it will be deliberate and will be obediently guided by the Holy Spirit. I humbly beg that you pray for the same.

Hi Charity Family,

Emily and I wanted to give you a brief update and thank you for your partnership in ministry. God has chosen us to steward the task of sending, training and mobilizing short-term missions teams across the nation into the hurting world. You can pray with us as we have 1,200 participants this summer on 50+ mission trips from our backyard to overseas countries. Many of these youth have never experienced what it is to have a relationship with Jesus, and our prayer is that they come alive in their faith on these mission trips.

Over the past couple of months, Emily and I trained and certified 55 mission leaders on the field with each team. We have traveled far and wide, visiting youth pastors at churches, pioneering new ministry locations, and praying for our nation's youth. We were ordained and commissioned with Adventures in Missions on April 25, and they have given us the official approval to be based in Bismarck. We work hard to mentor high school students, giving them jobs and learning about business, missions, and faith in our marketplaces. We can welcome our New American friends from all nations and help them make Bismarck feel less foreign. We host a missions team that directly helps with the ice cream shop. And, we get to see an impact through launching

This is something God has called us to, and we pray that it can be a light in the darkness here in our community as well.

We are blessed to serve and can't thank Charity enough for the support, encouragement, prayers and love. We especially want to thank those who have decided to follow this mission journey closely and continue to sow into what God is doing through us. We pray blessings over you all today as you read this update and know we are blessed to play a role in the Kingdom of God.


